WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR CHILD'S IEP?



THE PURPOSE OF AN IEP IS TO:

Prepare Children for Employment, Independent Living and Further Education

"The purposes of this title are to ensure that all children with disabilities have available to them a free appropriate public education that emphasizes special education and related services designed to meet their unique needs and prepare them for further education, employment and independent living."

DO YOU SEE THE IMPACT OF THE STATEMENT OF PURPOSE?

Your child is entitled to be prepared for Further Education, Employment and Independent Living based on their Unique Needs!

WHO IS THE EXPERT ON YOUR CHILD?

IEP GOALS

Find a goal and match it to your student's present level of performance.

- Does the goal show progress from the present level
- Is the goal measureable?
- What curriculum will be used?
- In what environment will the student be learning?
- What is the time frame?
- •What degree of accuracy measures success?
- Is the goal meaningful?

IEP NEEDS SOME WORK? WHAT'S THE NEXT STEP?

- Email your Special Ed coordinator for small changes where IEP may be able to be tweaked with out a full team IEP meeting.
- ❖If big changes are needed, email your team and ask for a new IEP meeting.
- Communicate what you want to change in writing before the meeting.
- *Ask for a draft with the changes to be sent to you 5 days prior to the meeting.

You know how frightened they are of them!

IEP TIPS

Do ask for a draft before the meeting.

Do treat the meeting as a business meeting.

Do bring your child for at least some of the meeting.

Do bring a friend or family member.

Do take notes or record the meeting.

Do ask them to give you reasoning behind any no answers in writing.

Do work on what your child needs going forward.

Do take a break or ask for an additional meeting if things get too emotional.

OTHER IMPORTANT IEP TIPS

Ask for the data used to determine your student's present level.

Make a plan for how data will be shared with you in the future.

Go over modifications and accommodations.

Know your child's placement and schedule.

Find out what reward system is being used.

Determine how therapy minutes will be used.

Put a plan for communication in place.

Go for No, but make sure No is documented.

If you don't show APPRECIATION to those that deserve it, they'll learn to stop doing the things you appreciate.

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ORGANIZATION

Utilize a notebook to keep important documents together.

Make a vision statement.

Include important information about your student.

Keep copies of everything in writing.

Keep most current information on top.

IS MY STUDENT'S IEP BEING IMPLEMENTED?

Contact 1 team member each week.

Make sure there is a plan to get you copies of data.

Question inconsistencies.

Communicate regularly.

Let them know that is OK if they try something that does not work.

Drop in unexpectedly.
